



#### Kenn Village Market & Coffee Morning


Thank you for supporting the market in October, it was good to see so many people.

#### Bird News

Bryan Thompson has been busy spotting rings on Gulls' legs during his visits to Weston seafront. He started with a Herring Gull that was ringed at Secret World after it had been rehabilitated and released by them three years ago. He then found a couple of Black Headed Gulls which, being smaller birds, carry smaller rings that he was unable to read. Fortunately a chap walking past had binoculars and a packet of crisps (Salt & Vinegar) which were deployed to tempt the bird a bit nearer! This bird was ringed at the huge landfill site at Pitsea in Essex and the second Black Headed Gull had been ringed in Berkshire. As Peter Rock the gull expert says 'Gulls legs are pretty interesting'!

Kenn Moor has quietened down bird wise since last month but a few Stonechats have arrived and I was delighted to see an Otter on Blackditch, my first locally in 35 years. A Kingfisher was also reported there, another was along Wemberham Lane and I received reports of one near Staddon's former premises in Clevedon and one at a garden pond in the middle of Yatton!

There were 15, Wheatears and 150 Meadow Pipits along the sea wall early in the month but a fortnight later they had moved on, the Wheatears heading for their wintering grounds in Africa and the pipits to grassland areas in the UK or Europe. The easterly winds brought an early flock of 25 Redwings to Congresbury Moor on the 10th and by then Skylarks were heading over on passage giving their musical contact calls. They can often be heard on fine mornings until mid November.

Finally, John Croxton has had two Grey Wagtails in his garden and a Fieldfare over on the 19th.

## Kenn Bat News

Yacwag's Anabat bat detector has been used to make an informal check of Bat species in the village. Over a period of two weeks in September three locations were used; one in Kenn Street (one night only), one in Duck Lane (five nights) and one on Nailsea Wall (five nights).

The results were :-

Kenn Street: Greater Horseshoe, Common & Soprano Pipistrelles,
Noctules and Serotines.

<u>Duck Lane</u>: Greater and Lesser Horseshoe, lots of Common
 Pipistrelles including the first local recording of 'singing' to attract mates, Soprano Pipistrelles, Serotines, Noctules and a Brown long-eared Bat.

Nailsea Wall: The Anabat detector was sited in the garden of Wild Orchard and this proved to be a real hot-spot! There were 14 passes of Greater Horseshoe, one pass of Lesser Horseshoe, a Nathusius on three consecutive nights. Lots of Myotis species including a likely Daubenton's. Plus Common & Soprano Pipistelles, lots of Serotine and Noctules plus a possible Brown long-eared Bat!

Summary: in this short monitoring period over 50% of all UK species were recorded and all the data will be submitted to the BRERC website and the Horseshoe records onto a specialist research map.

Many thanks to Irene Mills of Yacwag for advice and for downloading and reporting the findings.

#### ASIAN HORNET (Vespa Velutina)

This non-native hornet from Asia is a highly aggressive predator of native insects, posing a significant threat to honey bees and other pollinators.

There has been a sighting in the northern Mendips.

If you see one next spring it should be reported IMMEDIATELY to <u>alertnonnative@ceh.ac.uk</u>.

#### What to look out for

Vespa velutina queens are up to 3 cm in length; workers up to 25 mm (slightly smaller than the native European hornet Vespa crabro)

Entirely dark brown or black velvety body, bordered with a fine yellow band

Only one band on the abdomen: 4th abdominal segment almost entirely yellow/orange

Legs brown with yellow ends

Head black with an orange-yellow face

Vespa velutina is a day flying species which, unlike the European hornet, ceases activity at dusk.

They make very large nests high up in trees.


