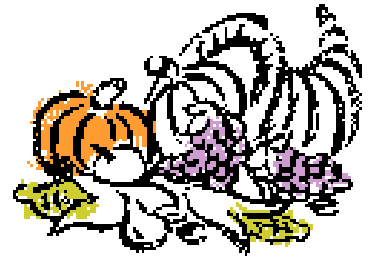

In 1966 Kilver Court was bought by Roger Saul as headquarters for the fashion empire Mulberry. Over time the gardens have been beautifully restored and have the backdrop of the Charlton viaduct within the grounds.

After the talk it was time to explore the gardens which include: the millpond and weir, dovecote ( which is used for civil wedding ceremonies ) lakes, viaduct, vegetable gardens and more....

A light lunch was served in what was the boardroom when the building was owned by Showerings. What lovely views could be seen from the windows, what a bonus.

Lunch was made from seasonal produce grown at Kilver Court and spelt which is grown and milled at Sharpham Park, which is also owned by Roger Saul.

After lunch there was time to look around the nursery and designer shops.

Many visited the Mulberry shop, but even at sale prices everyone resisted!!

This year the weather was kind to us and the day was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone.

Our speaker for the September meeting (14<sup>th</sup>) is Emma Britton from BBC Radio Bristol. Emma who belongs to a WI in Somerset is a lively personality and well suited to the radio. I am looking forward to her talk.

Jean would like to thank everyone for the cards and gifts which she received.

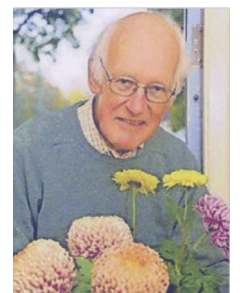

## **Bird News**

News from Duck Lane is of a Green Woodpecker feeding on ants with a juvenile Great Spotted Woodpecker in the garden at the same time. Thanks to Jon Hook for this report.

Nearby, Rob Treble spotted a Hobby flying over; any more sightings will be much appreciated.

Bryan Thompson saw another falcon species, this one a Peregrine first observed as a dot high in the sky, it tumbled down to still high altitude before setting off in pursuit of a flock of pigeons, outcome not known.

Our most recent attempt to see a Little Owl near the Village Hall was successful - a flypast just before 9pm - third time lucky!

A juvenile Lizard in our garden was a first, a Hedgehog nearby was an unusual sighting as was a large Grass Snake along the Strawberry Line. Judging by the number of dead animals on the roads there are obviously still some Hedgehogs around; no doubt there are good numbers of Grass Snakes but they are not often seen.

By the 24th of the month, migration had gathered pace along the sea wall with ten Wheatears and a Whinchat present. Waders present included a lovely summer plumage grey plover (look it up) , some colourful Turnstones, about 50 Ringed Plovers and 5 Curlew Sandpipers. A Water Rail was heard at the Blake's Pools reserve and around 120 Shelducks were on the estuary.

September is the peak time for migration, almost anything may turn up in your garden especially after rain so please let John Croxton or I know if you see something unusual.

## Neighbourhood Watch

**Received 7<sup>th</sup> July** Officers at Weston would like to make you aware that there have been calls received relating to a company around the area doing jobs for residents that are either not required or not done to satisfactory standard. These were cold calls from males who insisted on cash payments for the jobs. Both complainants received receipts for the money paid but the address on it does not exist. ***Remember that we should not have dealings with callers at the door and should never agree to have work done, or allow strangers into our property etc. If we feel threatened by such callers we should call the police immediately using the 999 system.*** If residents have received contact in recent days from callers as described above then please contact your local Trading Standards office at North Somerset Council, Telephone 01275-888631.



**Received 8<sup>th</sup> July** Overnight of 6-7 July a non dwelling break occurred at a property in Stowey Road, Yatton. Access was gained into a garage and a strimmer and pedal cycle were stolen.

**Received 19<sup>th</sup> July** Over the past few days there have been a number of incidents of theft (or attempted theft) from sheds and garages. These occurred mainly in the Portishead area but there has also been a report from Clevedon and it is possible that other areas may be targeted. In most of the incidents the sheds and garages were protected with good quality locks and whilst damage was caused very little has been stolen. This gives the victim a voice, holds offenders to account and encourages them to take responsibility for their actions. It has proved to be a very useful tool for those crimes that can be dealt with in this way, and colleagues who deal with this are keen to promote its benefits through the community.
