Bird News

The Buzzard found dead on Kenn

Moor mentioned in last month's News
and Views had been ringed in the
Gordano Valley so hadn't apparently
travelled far in its 24 years.

A Barn Owl was reported from the Wemberham Lane area of Yatton early in the month. With lengthening days and shorter hours of darkness there



may be a few more sightings now. In the same area 3 Goosanders were on the River Yeo and Skylarks were in full song. Later in the month they were joined by Reed Buntings uttering their brief three note song.

Fine sunny days produced lots of bird activity at Cadbury Hill, Yatton.

Green and Great Spotted Woodpeckers we're calling and drumming respectively, Nuthatches were vociferous but Treecreepers went about their business quietly as usual. A Mistle Thrush was singing and Marsh Tits were seen occasionally. Nearby a Yatton garden reported three Siskins visiting feeders.

Lapwings were displaying in two separate areas of Kingston Seymour, but were scarce elsewhere.

During the second half of the month Greenfinches suddenly found their voices and seemed to be everywhere.

Bryan Thompson found a Wheatear by the sea wall mid month and eight Sand Martins were seen there on the 25th. By then most Teal and Wigeon had left but there were still 250 Shelducks at the Yeo estuary.

On the same date, and more surprising a Garganey, our only summer migrant duck was seen from Kenn Pier.

There should be lots of summer birds arriving in April, let's hope for some favourable weather for them and us.

Memories triggered by a meeting with neighbours from my childhood, not seen for over sixty years.

On the 9th March 2019, I was kindly invited to an 80th birthday party, given by John and Betty White of Nailsea.

Betty, nee Hazell, had grown up in Kenn and has kept in touch with some of her Kenn



school friends of all those years ago, and had included in her guest list the two sisters Hillyer, Rosemary and Judith, see above photo of us three with Betty, taken by John Ball. Judith is on my right with Rosemary on my left and Betty second left.

The Hillyer family had lived just along the road from my home, 'Mill Farm' at 'Bow Cottage' named thus as it was close to the Bow Bridge over the river Kenn, beyond which you had Kenn Vicarage and another house, facing the Vicarage called 'Briarside', which had been constructed by my builder Grandfather, John Shopland in 1900, more on this later.

It was very pleasant to meet Rosemary and Judith again after so long and hear something of their life stories, which like most peoples, contained some sad passages as well as good and to remember that their Father, Mr Hillyer was employed by a leading publisher in London which published the very famous comic called The Eagle containing Dan Dare and The Mekon and was full of very educational articles for young people. Mr Hillyer arranged that my Brother Gerald and I received the weekly publications from the 1st Edition! And of course, these were not treasured and eventually burnt with the other household rubbish, which is a great shame, if only we had treasured them as we should and kept our copies.

The Hillyer's were a lovely family and neighbours to the Griffin's at Mill Farm and I think they must have left Bow cottage about 1955 when it was purchased by Bill and Gwyneth Yeates, with whom of course I was eventually to be involved in business and the Yeates business premises is built on land next to the one time orchard of Bow Cottage.

North Somerset Council steps in to save Yatton bus service -

A regular bus service for Yatton village will continue thanks to North Somerset Council. Following a review of the local bus network by First West of England, there will be a number of changes to bus services in North Somerset from

Sunday 28 April

As well as some minor changes to the Weston town centre network, First are planning extensive changes to the inter-urban "excel" network which links North Somerset with Bristol.

One major change includes the operation of bus service X7, which will link Bristol and Clevedon via Nailsea, but will no longer operate beyond Clevedon to Yatton and Weston-super-Mare.

The current route in Weston through Locking Castle and West Wick will instead be served by bus service X2 on an hourly basis. To address the loss of a regular service for Yatton village, North Somerset Council is using developer contributions to fund a replacement service. Following a tender process, First have been contracted to divert their service X2 to serve the length of Yatton High Street (as far as north end roundabout).

This ensures Yatton village maintains a regular link to Weston and creates a new link to Bristol city centre. The service will also operate earlier in the morning and later in the evening than the current X7 timetable.

Unfortunately, First's changes will result in the loss of a regular connection from Yatton to Clevedon and Nailsea.

Kenn village will also no longer have a regular service. This is due to very low passenger numbers on this part of the route, which has led to First withdrawing this section of bus service X7. The tender process has been unable to secure a replacement service for this area. However, Citistar service 128 will continue to operate on a Thursday.

Cllr Elfan Ap Rees, North Somerset Council's deputy leader and executive member responsible for transport, said: "I am pleased that we have been able to maintain a regular bus service for Yatton village following the operator's decision to withdraw the commercial service.

"This was due to low passenger numbers and, whilst the funding available to us has secured a service for the next three years, we need local people to support their bus service to ensure it can continue to operate in the long-term." The council will be holding a drop-in session with First West of England at Yatton Library on Tuesday 16 April for passengers to collect new timetable information, ask questions or raise concerns. Call in at any time between 10am and 11.30am.
