The **New Wine Annual Christian Holiday Camp** is held at the **Bath & Somerset Show Ground**.

Sadly, this will be the *last* one held in our area since it first started over 30 years ago by Bishop David Pytches.

Bird News

Thanks to Jeff Naish who phoned me early in the month to report a flock of 107 Lapwings that included a lot of young birds on one of his fields on Kenn Moor. This is a very unusual record so I cycled to the site and the birds were still feeding on the edge of the field.

Jeff had mentioned that there more grasshoppers than he had heard for years so perhaps the Lapwings were taking advantage of this glut. There must have been plenty of food for them as many of the birds were still there a fortnight later. Jeff also mentioned seeing several Skylarks on another field and I has also seen Skylarks singing and displaying on Kenn Moor mid month.

It's the time of year when I traditionally ask to be told about Hobby sightings. So far I have received two reports from Claverham and another two from the Strawberry Line so they may well be nesting locally.

Also, if you spot a Kingfisher please let me know as the British Trust for Ornithology believes that their numbers have fallen after the cold weather in March and April.

A check of the YACWAG owl boxes has revealed just one active Barn Owl nest with two owlets and it seems to be a less than average year for this species. However, this week there have been two juvenile Tawny Owls calling in Wemberham Lane, Yatton.

Along the estuary some migrant waders are already heading south with around 80 Dunlin feeding up towards the end of the month and there was a single (much rarer) Curlew Sandpiper.

Migration will gather pace in August and numbers on the estuary will increase.

Chairman's chat

The last Parish Council meeting was held in the Church room.

Mrs Iles gave us some information on the new application that had been submitted by Modwens. A lengthy discussion on the new plans ensued and we have reiterated our previous comments, adding in a few more points, using the report that we had from our Consultant.

The problem of parking at the garage had arisen again, but the reply from the Police is that you dial 101 if you feel that the pavement is blocked and report it there and then.

Speeding was also discussed. We will ask if the police horses can walk round which may serve as a deterrent but it is a problem which just will not go away.

Broadband...no change, ever hopeful.

Mrs Ball was in attendance, she informed us that works were being carried out at her property and trees and hedging removed, and a North Somerset tree officer had attended, we were unaware of him calling, but glad that he left happy and filled in on the works being done and the power people on site.

Mrs Ball asked about the speed sign not working, but JP informed that Chris Blake who helps out by changing the batteries etc had been given a new battery and it was soon up and running. We are grateful to Chris for looking after the sign for us .

At the meeting the Chairman informed that Mrs Cheryl Quinn had resigned as a councillor but would be continuing as the tree warden as this was a separate role.

Mrs Quinn had been a councillor for over 20 years, and continued in her role even after having her stroke, and rarely missed a meeting. Councillors wished to express their disappointment at her resigning and wished her well.

Personally I would like to thank Cheryl for her dedication to the Parish Council and her support and experience, she will be missed.

Parish Council meeting 2 July 2018

In attendance:

Sheila Naish, Wiff Bessant, J-P Humberstone, Robert Treble NS Cllr J Iles 1 Resident

Public Participation:

(1) Cllr Iles reported on NSC related items:

- Oakland's planning application had not been decided yet. The Internal Drainage Board had made some valid comments. Other concerns raised were about waste disposal arrangements and monitoring to ensure the unit was not changed into 'public use.' *KPC had supported the IDB's comments and had also made an observation about waste disposal arrangements in their comments.*
- St Modwen's application determination deadline had been extended again.
- Verges, the previous Area Officer had been replaced and the issues were being progress with the new officer.

(2) The resident expressed concern that they appeared to have been reported for clearing trees on their property and had received a visit from a NSC officer. Also Western Power were replacing the sub station and the battery in the speed sign appeared to need changing. *The Chairman assured the resident that KPC knew nothing relating to the tree event, also the councillor who oversaw battery arrangements advised, as far as he was concerned, everything had been done.*

Other business:

- The area around the valeting and garage is still causing concern, with cars blocking the area and cars being parked on the pavement – all of which were causing hazards on the very busy B3133. The Police were asked to carry out checks but perhaps the businesses had outgrown the site.
- Updates were given on: **Broadband:** Gigaclear have provided a schedule on their website showing broadband work to commence in August for Kenn. **Verges:** had been cut. **Hedges:** will be trimmed in the autumn. **Barns Ground pond:** the IDB had not replied yet. **Village Flowers:** the planters/pots etc had been planted up with flowers for the summer.
- **Planning** – KPC had been asked to make comments on St Modwen's revised proposals for their site. 16/P/2582/FUL – *Outline application for residential-led mixed use development to comprise up to 125 new homes and 3.24ha (8 acres) of employment and community uses which may include B1, B2, B8, and D1 uses and associated infrastructure.
