

Emergency Services Open Day - Somerset - Sunday 15th September

This year's Emergency Services Open Day will be on Sunday 15 September at Police & Fire HQ from 10.30am-4pm. This is our opportunity to showcase the incredible work we do, and how we work alongside other emergency services in Avon and Somerset to keep our communities safe.

This year the programme of events will include displays from Avon and Somerset's Police Dog, Mounted and Firearms section as well as car cutting and search and rescue demonstrations from Avon Fire & Rescue.

Younger visitors are invited to join the Major Crimes team and become a detective for the day. They will be able to visit a crime scene, investigate the evidence and then find out if their hard work has paid off when the offender is revealed at the end of the day.

As well as the Constabulary and Avon Fire and Rescue Service; representatives from Mountain Rescue, HM Coastguard, British Red Cross, RNLI and Wessex 4 x 4 will be at the event.

July is a quiet month for birds, song early on diminishes as the month progresses, young birds become independent and the adults rest and moult.

Last month I mentioned a Barn Owl (seen by Rob Treble) at Nailsea Wall and there have been further sightings. Unfortunately the owl boxes there are in a poor state of repair so I am in correspondence with the Environment Agency to see if replacement boxes can be provided in the winter. The three Owlets in the Yacwag box near the Strawberry Line have now fledged and an adult Barn Owl was spotted near the new Estate at North End, Yatton. And on the topic of Owls, Jackie Huxtable found a **Little Owl in Cooks Lane; there haven't been many sightings of Little Owls** recently.

A few Red Kites were seen, by Margaret Ball and Bryan Thompson over Kenn and Win Lowman, Yacwag's Secretary over Yatton, all early in the month. The Clevedon Peregrines have one youngster but they seem to have been very elusive this season. It has been a poor year generally for our local Peregrines but there is still a healthy population. The maize field Lapwings at Kingston Seymour defied the predators and the experts to produce at least two flying young. Lapwings are long lived birds so that is quite a good outcome. A few more Swallows have arrived and Greenfinches are making a comeback. On Puxton Moor a Quail was calling, an unusual bird for this area, but Quail arrive in the UK in bigger numbers in some years and 2019 has been one of those years.

Wike and Iris Callow were pleased to see a pair of Green Woodpeckers in their garden, and a family with three juveniles were in a garden near Kingston bridge.

A Kingfisher by Wemberham rhyne was pleasing and surprising in equal measure They are generally Autumn and Winter birds here. I think that this one was a juvenile perhaps looking for a territory.
