BIRD NEWS

This winter has been notable for the small numbers of winter thrushes and small birds such as Meadow Pipits in the local area. There are records of large flocks of Redwings and Fieldfares in North Wales and Lancashire and perhaps the effect of climate change and a particularly mild winter is the cause. However the mild weather seems to suit our Song Thrushes as Jenny Croxton heard four singing on her morning walk and there were three in a small area in Wemberham Lane, Yatton. The same place had a regular Kingfisher as did the River Yeo at Congresbury and John Croxton saw one at Kenn Pier. There was a flock of 400 Lapwings on a recently slurried field at the far end of Wemberham Lane.

Kenn Moor and Littlewood have been notably quiet. This is the first winter that I have not seen a Little Grebe on Blackditch and my best count of Teal is currently two! Treecreepers showed occasionally and the feeding Goldfinch flock reached 80 but there was otherwise little else of note. In Clevedon the wintering Black Redstart has been showing by the pier, the drake Mandarin Duck is still on the Land Yeo near Strode Road whilst the Blind Yeo has hosted a few Goosanders.

Despite the wet weather there are a number of Barn Owls surviving in various Yacwag boxes and our local Tawny Owl was calling close by. Bryan Thompson heard a Tawny calling from Kenn churchyard. And talking of the churchyard I am pleased to report that both bird boxes had nests in them. I have cleaned them out ready for this Spring.

The sea wall has turned up a few surprises, not least a flock of 28 Avocets, a record for this site. The peak Dunlin count was 1,500 whilst Peregrine, Merlin and 2 Short Eared Owls were all seen. Small birds were few and far between but the wintering Stonechats are holding on.

At the January meeting of the Kenn W.I. members discussed the resolutions that have been put forward for the AGM in London in the summer.



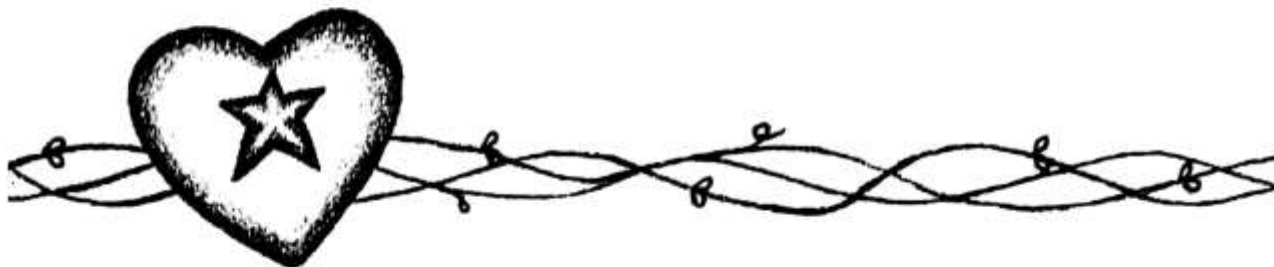

Residents are encouraged to take note of the following burglary prevention advice,

particularly regarding securing your home and boundaries, and looking out for one another including elderly neighbours.



- Lock up and set the alarm, if you have one, at night as well as when you go out.
- Lock all your windows and doors every time you leave your house – even if you are just in the garden – and remembering to double lock UPVC doors.
- Remove valuables from view of ground floor windows.
- Hide any high value items such as jewellery, handbags/wallets and passports etc and where possible store them in a properly secured and hidden safe or bank vault.
- Keep entrances to your property easily visible by ensuring nearby hedges and trees are well maintained.
- Ensure any side gates are securely locked to prevent unwanted access to the rear of your property.
- Make sure boundaries to your property – including fencing and walls – are in a good state of repair.
- If possible, install a visual burglar alarm.
- Where possible install an outside security light, many of which are sensor activated.
- Where possible, leave radios and lights in your house on a timer to make the property appear occupied.
- Ensure you let trusted neighbours know when you are going away so they can keep an eye on your home.
- Consider joining your local Neighbourhood Watch scheme.

KENN PARISH COUNCIL**2020****PARISH COUNCIL MEETING – 6 JANUARY 2020**

The topics covered on the agenda were:

WILDFLOWER AREA

- Working to create an area of wildflower meadow on The Green. It was agreed to consult on the best area to cultivate this, then to initially prepare the area and buy the appropriate seeds.
- To work with the grass cutting contractor to ensure it is only cut at the correct time of the year.

GRASS CUTTING CONTRACT

- To include in the Financial Year 2020/21 the extra cost for regular strimming of the side growth on the footpath up to the Motorway Bridge
- Also keeping the bus stop situated on the grass verge trimmed throughout the year.

LILLYPOOL DROVE Confirmation of Modification Order 61

- Restricted Byway LA 21/46, Claverham Grove northerly direction where it passes into Kenn
- Restricted Byway LA 10/8, westerly direction terminating at adopted highway Kennmoor Road

STREET TRADING ON KENN BUSINESS PARK

- Confirmation from North Somerset Council (NSC) that they had passed on the comments of Kenn Parish Council to the applicants, which were; a query on the siting of the unit, avoiding practices of the previous license holder, ie unapproved use of a public drain, neglecting to clear litter arising from their trading.

GRASS VERGES & HEDGE FLAILING

- Agreed to via an unused sum (set aside for objecting to housing proposals on the St Modwen site) to be used in 2020/21 for continuing the works started last year.

STRENGTHENING POLICE POWERS TO TACKLE UNAUTHORISED ENCAMPMENTS

- Agreed to strongly support these proposals.

NSC DRAFT CORPORATE PLAN

- It was felt the plan was too urban based in its objectives. Limited mention of rural communities.

PROPOSED CAR PARKING CHARGES IN CLEVEDON, NAILSEA AND PORTISHEAD

- Agreed to make the following comments: For people from rural areas and villages who need to visit local towns the proposed car parking charges are considered onerous. The reason being that due to the lack of access to good and regular rural public transport, therefore, rural folk have limited options other than to use their cars to drive and park to be able to access facilities.

FINANCES & PRECEPT FOR 2020/21

Details of income and expenditure were considered. It was agreed to keep the precept the same as last year.
