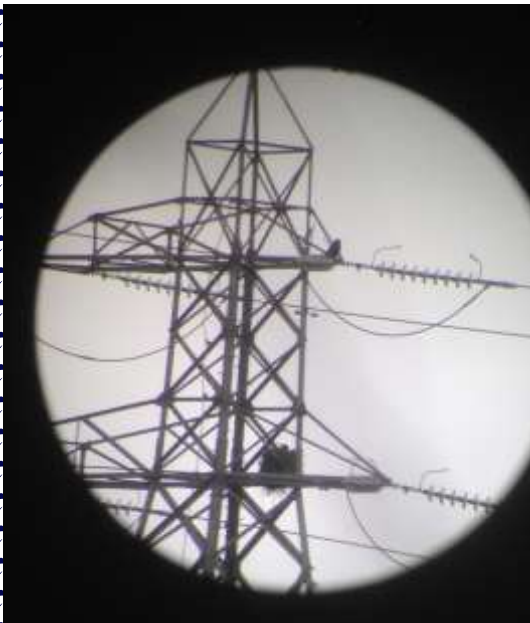

Bird News

Backwell lake has hosted a roost of Little Egrets in winter for a couple of years, but now they are being joined by Great White Egrets.

Higgy's picture shows one of each species and the marked size and bill colour differences. He recorded 26 Little Egrets and 2 Great White Egrets roosting in the trees on the island, when he visited. The lake is a very valuable wildlife site in a suburban area with Otter, Kingfisher and in winter Goosander and Water Rail regularly present.



David Lumkin's picture depicts Ravens refurbishing their nest on the pylon between Kingston Seymour and Kenn. Ravens are early nesters and may well lay their eggs in early March. A Peregrine, usually a small male has also been seen on several of the pylons almost as far as Congresbury but this bird should be moving to its own breeding site soon.

Winter thrushes have generally been in short supply so it was good to see 150 Redwings in Kingston Seymour. Three squealing Water Rails along the Strawberry Line was unusual and a garden in Kingston Seymour was attracting five Blackcaps. Five Jack Snipe were in Yacwag's Kenn Moor reserve near Yatton and this was a record.

Chaffinches started singing on the 11th February and by the 21st Skylarks were also singing. The first Wheatears should be arriving around the middle of March, with Chiffchaffs singing and then Blackcaps joining them later in the month.

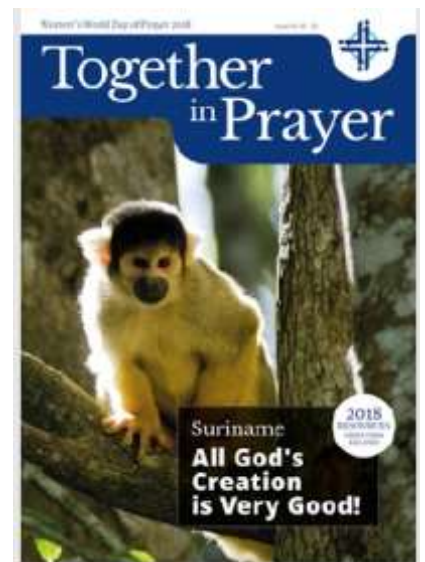

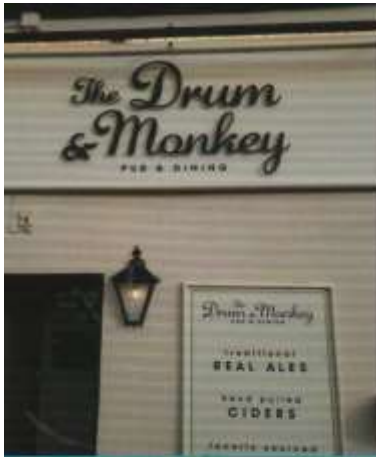

SEASONAL ADVICE FROM OUR CRIME REDUCTION OFFICER

With Spring hopefully 'around the corner', many of us will be thinking about getting back into our gardens. So have a look at the security of your shed or outbuildings.

- Before upgrading locks or fitting alarms have a look at the shed structure first. Is it sound or are parts a bit rotten? Is the roof secure? Is the door and door frame still sound?
- There's no point upgrading locks or fitting alarms if the thief can kick through a weakened door panel or lift an insecure roof.
- When upgrading your locks and hinges use 'clutch screws' or coach bolts as fixings as these cannot be undone.
- Double up on the door shackle and hasp with one fitted a third of the way up and the second a third of the way done from the top of the door. The hinges can then be reinforced with hinge pins.
- Choose closed shackle padlocks preferably with a 'Sold Secure' rating. These are more resistant to attack than conventional padlocks.

If your shed or outbuilding has a window, be sure to cover the inside so that the thief cannot see in and see what's available to steal. Opaque film applied to the inside works well here, it also makes the window more difficult to break. Consider fitting laminated glass or steel security mesh – or both.

If someone does manage to gain access to your shed, make life difficult for them by:

- Chaining everything together with a heavy duty chain and padlock.
- If the shed has a concrete base, consider a ground anchor and chain your mower and bikes to this. You can now get wall anchors, they strengthen the structure of the shed considerably.
- Mark everything with your post code. 'Damage' mark if necessary – make it less attractive to the thief.

Force-wide message - Livestock Worrying

This message is sent on behalf of our Rural Crime Teamed and aimed at all dog walkers and we would be grateful if you could pass this on:

Livestock worrying is a big issue especially as we approach the Spring. We are seeing an increase in such reports and would like to take this opportunity to politely remind dog walkers to keep their animals on leads around livestock.

Remember to follow the Countryside Code, <https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/the-countryside-code/the-countryside-code> especially during lambing season.

If your dog attacks livestock, you could end up being responsible for offences including criminal damage and sheep worrying, as well as potential prosecution for offences under the Dangerous Dogs Act.

Farmers also have the right to shoot dogs that are worrying or attacking livestock. We don't want anyone to lose their beloved family pet.

The Avon and Somerset Police Rural Crime Team recommends:

- Always checking for livestock in fields when walking your dog/s
- Always making sure you shut gates behind you
- When in or near fields with livestock, keep your dog/s on a lead and under control at all times. The only time you should release your dog is in the event of being chased by cattle. By restraining the dog in this circumstance you put yourself at risk of being injured
- If you live near livestock and own a dog/s make sure that your property and garden are secure so your pets cannot escape

Leading rural insurer NFU Mutual saw a 50% rise in dogs attacks on livestock in the UK in 2016.

Who can attend the meeting? – Anyone may attend but only registered electors in the parish of Kenn may speak and vote.

Will I be able to ask questions and make resolutions? – Any registered Kenn elector may ask questions of the Council. These will usually be answered by the chairman or a designated Councillor. An elector may also make suggestions, comment on parish issues and propose resolutions. Resolutions are only to endeavour to persuade but will be considered by the Parish Council at future meetings.

Who will chair the meeting? – The Chairman of the Parish Council must chair the meeting, if present. In his absence the vice chairman must preside if present. If neither can attend, then the meeting will elect a chairman from those electors present.

Will Parish Councillors be there? – Although there is no compulsion, Councillors normally attend. They will speak if required, but the purpose of the meeting is to enable the ordinary electors to have their say. Councillors will listen with interest and as electors themselves, also have the opportunity to raise questions and make comments if they wish.

Will notes be taken of the meeting? – A written record of the meeting will be taken by the Parish Clerk. The rules on the signature and admissibility of minutes are the same as those for Parish Council meetings.
