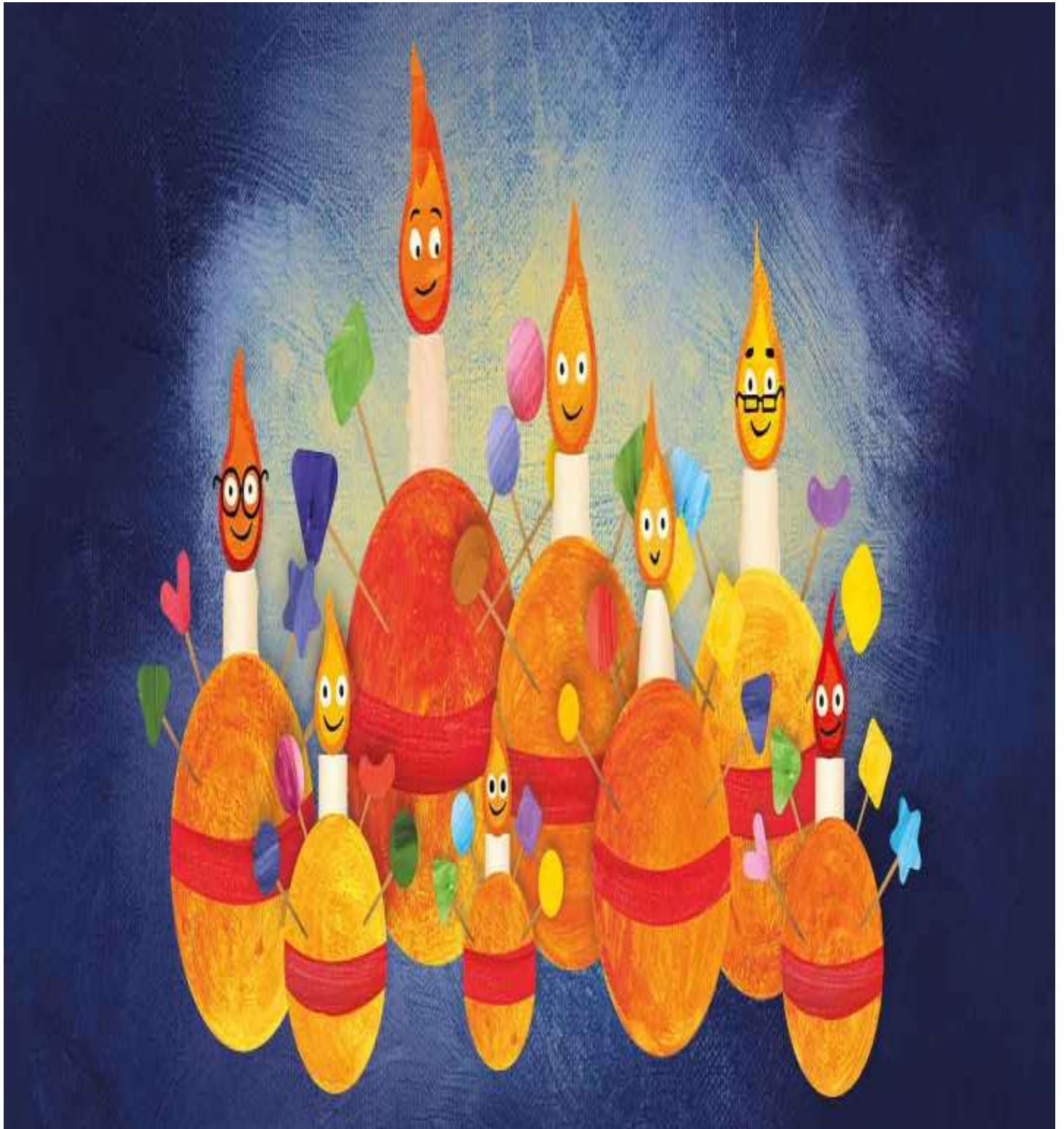

Bird News

Owl species have been in the news this month with Jackie Huxtable reporting a Barn Owl one evening in Cooks Lane. The farmer in Wemberham Lane, Yatton also reported a Barn Owl leaving his hay barn at dusk and another was present in one of the YACWAG owl boxes.

Tawny Owls seem to have been quite vocal with calling heard in Yatton and Claverham and by Matt Butland in Duck Lane. Rob Treble also reported a Tawny Owl from Kenn Pier and more unusually a Merlin spotted in Claverham **Drove. Shortly before Rob's sighting John Croxton and I saw a Merlin heading** determinedly south west along the Dowlais Farm stretch of the sea wall then a couple of weeks later another at the Kenn estuary. This was a tiny male and seems to have been disturbed by a passing Peregrine which beat a hasty retreat. We think that the Merlin may have been on a kill and was not going to be robbed.

However, by far the most interesting and rarest sighting at the Kenn estuary was a Long Tailed Skua. John Croxton and Clevedon birder Howard Taffs **bumped into this major rarity and Howard's splendid picture shows most of the** features. Apparently the bird was so confiding it came too near to take a photo at one stage. It is extremely similar to the more common but still unusual Arctic Skua (Long tailed skuas only have long tails in the breeding season) and **was identified by experts from Howard's series of pictures.**

Long tailed skuas nest in the Arctic which probably accounts for their lack of concern about human presence and they winter off the coast of Namibia. Unlike other skua species which pirate other sea birds Long tailed feed on lemmings in the breeding season and their numbers fluctuate with lemming populations.

The last of the Wheatears has moved through and there was a late Hobby and a passage of Swallows by the River Yeo on the 5th. A few Redwings were on Kenn Moor on the 20th and Stonechats are back on regular winter territories. Goldfinches were noted in large flocks on Kenn Moir, Duck Lane, Claverham and no doubt at other places. Finally there seems to be good numbers of Kingfishers; birds have been seen at Yatton, Congresbury and Worle.

CARING IN BRISTOL AT CHRISTMAS

Having recently visited Brighton we were shocked by the number of desperate homeless people there, who are sleeping rough on the streets.

This is replicated in Bristol so once again we are intending to organise Kenn's always generous contributions to be delivered in the week ending 20/12/19.

This year they have changed the system and are again accepting food and clothing.

As they say they are only a small team and they do not have time to sort through inappropriate donations so they only need the following:

CLOTHES (warm, good quality, winter)

NEW underwear and socks, jumpers, jeans, trainers, boots, waterproof coats, rucksacks, belts, sleeping bags and blankets (NO duvets)

TOILETRIES (miniatures and full size)

Shampoo, shower gel, toothbrushes, toothpaste, Non Aerosol deodorants, disposable razors, wet wipes, tissues,

OTHER:

Toilet rolls, laundry powder, puzzle books, books, arts & crafts supplies.

FOOD:

Instant coffee, tea bags, squash, individual soft drinks, multipack crisps and chocolate bars, confectionery, biscuits, long life juice, jam, marmalade, chocolate spread, marmite, peanut butter, sugary cereal, rice, pasta, instant noodles, tinned goods, pickles, mayonnaise and sauces.

They are also using the services of Fareshare who collect excess items from supermarkets and manufactures so that they will lessen their food footprint.

They also need money as it costs a lot to keep the centre going.


Please leave donations in the Church Porch or let us have them at Church Path Cottage.

MY MEMORIES OF KENN SCHOOL by MARGARET BESSANT

My earliest memories of Kenn school at the tender age of 4 years 11 months was crying every lunch time and Hartley being told "your sister is crying again".

Being parted from your mother for all those hours each day was very upsetting, as there was no pre-school in those days.

I remember having to rest afternoons in the early years on a small coconut mat for one and a half hours afternoons in the corner of the big classroom. In the window where we lay was a very large green object, which I was told was a kind of coconut.

The play times were very happy, later I remember playing 'The farmers in his den', 'Oranges and Lemons', and 'Here we go Looby Loo' and lots of Leap Frog.

Can you all remember the black sheet of card on the wall with an 'A' for apple, 'B' for ball and 'C' for cat etc? Also the Times Tables chart from 1-12 that we used to chant each day, it never did us any harm.

I still remember them well and have put them to use many times.

We sometimes went on a nature walk with Mrs Griffiths down Bakers Lane, which was opposite Orchard House, we picked wild flowers and brought them back to school and had to name them all after looking them up in a large flower book.

Each week, I believe it was a Friday, the children in our family brought 6d. (two and a half pence) each to school to buy a National Savings stamp, which were stuck into a small oblong book. I think the stamps had a flag on them. When you had £5, a National Savings Certificate was bought which made interest after 5 years.

In my last year at Kenn school, Mrs Griffiths would send me to Kenn Post office on a Friday, to bank the savings money, also buy some postage stamps. After that it was down to Mrs Stowell (Brian's mother) to buy 6 eggs, which she would carefully put into a little box for me.

I attended Kenn school 1945-1951, although it was a small school we all learned the basics and more, which I have found very useful in my life.
