The big news from the August Parish Council meeting is that superfast broadband is coming to Kenn. Gigaclear have plans to begin installation of the infrastructure in late November with the system going live

during the spring of 2019. With the infrastructure in place, individual properties will then have the choice to take out a contract for broadband with Gigaclear. If you want to know more, including the prices for broadband you can look on their website at Gigaclear.com, or read on for a summary of some of the basic costs and packages available.

What does this mean for me you may ask?

Well, if you don't own a computer or use the internet, probably not a lot, except your house will have probably gone up in value and be more saleable as a result of the infrastructure being installed in the village.

If, however, you and your household are regular users of the internet, for entertainment, pleasure or for work, or perhaps you would like access to a whole new world of TV or video calling to friends and family, then this may be the moment you have been waiting for.

Gigaclear install superfast broadband via fibre direct to your door and is pretty much the fastest thing out there for internet speeds, hopefully future-proofing the village for decades to come.

The basic broadband package is Home 50 at 50Mbps, which is around 20 times faster than what we get at present. Their top package offers speeds close to 1Gbps. Expect some marketing people to be in touch nearer the time, they may even have some introductory deals on offer.

BIRD NEWS

A visual check of the Yacwag Barn Owl boxes has revealed no sign of any late nests so the score is just two Owlets fledged this year.

The Swallows at the Wemberham Lane roost departed on the 2nd September (quite an early date) and after then the Starlings ceased to use the site. It remains to be seen if a Starling roost forms when the wintering birds arrive.

Whilst a lot of our Swallows and House Martins have left there was a report of lots at Shapwick Heath on the 21st, with Sand Martins. These were passage birds, feeding up in wet and windy weather.

A reader telephoned me at the end of August to report several Jackdaws tucking in to his apples (still on the tree) and asked if this was unusual. Well I have never witnessed it but Jackdaws are utterly omnivorous and that is one reason why they are so successful as a species. Birds with restricted diets and habitats are generally rare.

Also at the end of last month Steve Edwards saw over a hundred Pied Wagtails on a field opposite Kenn Court.

Migration is progressing along the sea wall and a Short Eared Owl mid month was a very welcome find and quite an early date for this species.

A couple of Whinchat and a Wheatear had stopped on their journey south whist on the mud 50 Ringed Plovers and a few Black Tailed Godwits were refuelling on their migrations.

A Green Woodpecker was a more unlikely spot (there) but this may have been a young bird seeking a territory.

The garden birds are gradually returning after moult. Coal Tit and Bullfinch have reappeared here and by the end of the month the first Redwings and Fieldfares should have arrived.

The time for our annual Flower Demonstration is fast approaching.



If you call the number and you start to hear a recorded message you will already have been billed £315 for the phone call.

If you do receive a card with these details, then please contact Royal Mail Fraud on 020 7239 6655.
