Message from Warren and Diana.

Warren writes, dear friends, many of you may be aware in July this year I reached three score years and ten. A time when clergy serving the Church of England are generally expected to retire or to do so fairly soon thereafter.

As I approached that date I was most grateful to receive permission to extend my ministry which has allowed us sufficient time to find a suitable location for our retirement, a place that we felt right for us, which we now have done.

Sadly therefore, the time has now come for us to journey into that new phase, but we won't be moving too far away, only to the village of Churchill the other side of Congresbury, which in ecclesial terms lies within the Deanery of Locking. Our last Sunday before I retire will be the 30th September.

It has been a wonderful privilege over the past five and three-quarter years to serve amongst you as an associate priest within the Yatton Moor Parish, whilst having special responsibility for All Saints, Kingston Seymour and St. John the Evangelist, Kenn within the Team.

Firstly and very briefly under team rector Rev Ian Hubbard, then Rev David Harrex (since retired) who was in charge during the interregnum and alongside clergy colleagues Rev John Andrews (very briefly), Rev Avril Gaunt and Iay ministers, Readers Messrs. Allan Attwood, Paul Stalder and Mrs. Myra Birdsall (now retired). Later under our present team rector, Rev Tim Scott, who is married to Linda who is also a valued priest colleague within the team. It has also been a great blessing to us all in having the Rev Jo (now Stobbard) serving her curacy in our parish of Yatton Moor.

On the 17th September, the Rev Nigel Thomas will be joining the team and we wish him and his wife Nicky all the very best for the future. Nigel and I were studying theology at Cardiff in the early nineties. I know him to be a good and faithful servant of the Lord. I feel sure Nigel and Nicky will be a true blessing to everyone they meet.

I also want to thank all our churchwardens, church officials, organists, PCC members, choirs, bell ringers, parishioners and friends for their enthusiasm and support over our years with you which has been so encouraging.

I am grateful to Diana who has always been so supportive to my *house for duty* ministry and has actively assisted in so many ways, such as helping in our unique All Age 11.00 monthly informal services, sharing our 'talks' with the assistance of many of our young folk, their parents, other helpers not to mention the puppet contribution and an occasional successful Christian illusion (a trick or two)!

Diana has also felt privileged to lead the weekly Wednesday evening study group at Kingston Seymour as well as helping with Transformers at St. Mary's, Yatton.

We have amazing memories of all the times we have shared with you and for friendships made along the way.

As we look back over each Christian liturgical year it is good to reflect on all those special times and services we have experienced together, such as Advent preparations, Christmas and all that it means to us, the joyous Crib and Carol Services; Good Lenten practices, bible study group, Holy Week leading up to Easter celebrations and not forgetting the unique West Country practice of having an occasional Wassail, ours being within a Christian setting of blessings of Apple Trees, Orchards, farm land, animals and all the lovely people around us.

Also, our annual Plough Sunday celebrations with fond memories of dear folk who have now departed this life who always held the land and the agricultural community dear to their hearts, within church and rural parish setting.

In recent years we have also held an annual Lammas service in Richard and Anita Simmons' Barn, followed by a barbeque and bar, not to mention baa's from surrounding sheep, moo's from cows all livened up one year with a bull escaping from the field just as my sermon was about to commence so that Richard and Ed suddenly had to rush off to deal with the situation, what a coincidence that was:

The special memorable events at St. John's Kenn also bring back lasting memories, such as the special celebrations held at various times of the year in the church and in the village hall; wonderful gospel singers from Bristol that had everyone swaying in the aisles, semi-professional, and professional opera singers enthralling us with their marvellous voices, excellent musical accompaniment and choral singing from wonderful talented international and local artistes, charitable village and church concerts, the delightful cream teas, lunches and suppers provided at both churches throughout our time with you.

It has also been a privilege and delight to occasionally officiate when called upon at St. Mary's Yatton, Holy Trinity Cleeve and St. Barnabas Claverham and to get to know so many wonderful people.

We could go on and on but I won't, I am not known for long addresses or sermons.

Blay Family News.

At present, school fees for Denis's three children average out at £5 each week each child. It would be a project with an end point, as, if Denis's widow were to marry again, her new husband would be responsible for any further children.

Michael would be responsible for his children.

I have had several suggestions how we might raise the money, I think variation is the key.

My first action is to use the profits from cake sales at the September Village Market and host a larger than usual coffee morning at the end of the month.

The next group will be on Thursday 13th September 2018 at 11.00am.



Bird News

The two Barn Owlets reported last time have thrived and have probably fledged now. One of their parents may have been the bird spotted by John and Margaret along Claverham Drove one evening. I shall check the Congresbury Moor box again where a pair was present in July as it is possible, with the recent rain and lower temperatures that they may still nest.

Migration got under way in August with 400 Dunlin and 150 Ringed Plover by the sea wall. There were a few Common Sandpipers, several Turnstones looking very bright in their summer plumage and a beautiful gold and black Golden Plover. Six Wheatears were present on the 13th and an unexpected sight was a young Shelduck diving, something I had not seen before.

A Little Owl was heard then seen in the Duck Lane/ Kenn Street area and at Wemberham Lane, Yatton there was a roost of Starlings and Swallows, with about 250 of each species. For good measure a few Pied Wagtails joined them in the Reed bed.

On the Avalon Marshes near Glastonbury the regular August Osprey has arrived and I was fortunate to see it catch a fish which took two minutes from leaving its perch to return with the prey. This is almost certainly the same bird that has come to the site every year since 2008. It is unringed so we can't be certain but it's almost constant arrival and departure dates over the years, together with its favoured perch and habits suggest that it is the same individual. As Ospreys can reach 25 years of age, lots of people hope that it will continue to return for many years to come.

To be eligible to stand for election as a Parish Councillor you must be :-

- At least 18 years old.
- Be a British Citizen, an eligible Commonwealth Citizen or a Citizen of any member state of the European Union, and meet at least one of the following:-
 - You are and will continue to be registered as a local government elector for the parish/community in which you wish to stand from the day of your nomination onwards.
 - You have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish/community area during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election.
 - Your main or only place of work during the 12 months prior to the day of your nomination and the day of election has been in the parish/community area.
 - You have lived in the parish/community area or within 3 miles of it during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election.

You are not permitted to stand for election as a Parish Councillor if you :-

- Are employed by the Parish Council.
- Are the subject of a Bankruptcy Restriction Order or Interim Order.
- Have within 5 years before the day of the election, been convicted in the United Kingdom of any offence and have a prison sentence (whether suspended or not) for a period of over 3 months without the option of a fine.
- You have been disqualified under the Representation of People Act 1983 (which covers corrupt or illegal electoral practices and offences relating to donations).
